ASSIGNMENT:

- 2. Create a small-scale artwork that illustrates each corresponding element and principle on the left side of your page. You will have 9 small artworks that represent the <u>elements</u> with their corresponding written definitions, and 7 small artworks that represent the <u>principles</u> with their corresponding written definitions when you are finished. Draw each artwork in a 3X3 inch square minimum. Make sure to fill in each square completely and color each square completely.
- 3. You will be graded on completing each element and principle correctly, meeting format requirements, and effort and craftsmanship.
